TTRS – 5 minutes Daily


Access TTRS on Jamming and Garage to boost standings in the weekly competitions.

<u>Maths</u>


We are starting our maths learning by exploring place value of numbers. Recapping what we have already learnt and extending to larger numbers.

<u>Science</u>

Animals is science topic this half term, with a focus on movement and nutrition. We will explore the skeleton and what animals need to keep healthy.

<u>History</u>

We are learning about the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. We will explore what life was life as well as link to modern times.



<u>English</u>

We are exploring traditional tales to begin with and applying these to writing character descriptions. Then we will move onto writing instructions using the text 'How to wash a woolly mammoth'

<u>Art</u>
