Homework

We are expecting that children complete the following homework each week:

Reading – 5 minutes Daily

Reading every day and written in children's reading record. This can be a coloured book or a reading for pleasure book from home.

Statutory Spellings – 2x per week

Lists sent out each half term and to be practised in Homework books. These are statutory spellings for the age group (Y2 or Y3) and need to be learnt by heart by the end of the academic year.

TTRS or Numbots - 2x per week

Access TTRS on Jamming and Garage to boost standings in the weekly competitions or Numbots to develop number knowledge.

Year 2 - CGP SATs Book - Pages set each week.

Set on a Thursday/Friday and to be returned the following Thursday.

Year 3 - Maths White Rose Book - Pages set each week.

Set on a Friday and to be returned the following Thursday.

Homework is to ensure that children have a great foundation to all their learning and can apply this in school. We really appreciate the time taken to support your child at home and can really see the difference it makes to your child's progress.

Below are some additional <u>optional</u> topic-based homework ideas that can be completed over the half term to deepen and extend knowledge that is learnt in school. This needs to be handed in on <u>Monday 18th March</u> so that we can show off our amazing home learning.

'Mathematician in Training'

Explore measuring objects. What can you measure them in? What would you measure in km, m and cm?

Make a poster to show your work.

'Budding Author'

We have been practising writing descriptions.

Design and create your own animal and write a description about it.

<u>'The Attenborough</u> <u>Award'</u>

As it comes into the warmer weather, spend time outside and create a diary of the plants and animals that you see.

'PE Guru'

We love lots of the usual sports such as football, tennis etc. What other sports can you explore? What sports are in the Olympics? Create a list of these and have a go at learning the rules.

'Wellbeing Master'

Learning a new instrument can be tricky. Find an instrument at home (real or homemade) and learn to play your favourite song.

Learning this half term

Maths

Year 2 children are consolidating learning in preparation for their SATS. Year 3 children are exploring fractions.
