WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING THIS WEEK

This week, Swallows have been using imperative (bossy) verbs to give instructions to each other. It wasn't as easy as we initially thought, when we had to tell our partner how to put on a jumper and we realised how bossy Mrs Walker is as she uses imperative verbs all the time! We also used the apples from the garden to make a crumble, using our imperative verbs. The crumble was delicious! Swallows have also shown a huge interest in spiders, going on spider hunts and trying to identify the different types. We have created our own spiders and webs and read lots of books about them. We also played games where the 'fly' has to escape the web before the spider catches it. In Maths the children have been learning all about 2-D and 3-D shapes. The Reception children enjoyed going on a shape hunt outside, the Year one children have been investigating making different shapes with straight lines and the Year 2's have enjoyed making octagons from lolly sticks!

Our learning has included a real focus on writing and the children have enjoyed using different techniques to practise all the features of a really great sentence.
