ROAD SAFETY

As we continue our drive to improve the safety of our children at Ripley, and as part of our Gate Duties, a member of staff will now be acting as a crossing patrol person to guide our children and families across the road safely.

If you are crossing from the Town Hall side, please use the path opposite the metal barrier where the patrol crossing will be located every morning and afternoon. This is a clearer crossing and not obstructed by any parked cars, vans in front of the school building.

A reminder that parents should park in the village carpark. If you do need to use the Town Hall carpark, please ensure all exits and entrances are kept clear of vehicles at all times and cars are parked safely to avoid blocking people in and obstructions to pedestrian's.

In addition, we advise you log any near misses to NYC 95 Alive by emailing as a paper trail/log. The North Yorkshire and York 95 Alive Road Safety Partnership work together with the collective aim of reducing the number of people killed and seriously injured on the County's roads.
