Class 1 - Reception

Reception have had a very busy half term. This half term has been all about 'growing'. 
Class 1 - KS1

In Year 1 and 2 the children have really enjoyed making 3D sculptures as part of their art topic. The children explored folding, twisting and bending paper to make their sculptures they particularly enjoyed their 'tree of life' creations! As well as Art the children have been learning all about plants as part of Science, the children had the opportunity to plant sunflowers, learn what plants need to survive as well as a plant life cycle. In R.E we also had the opportunity to go and look round the local church and identify features of a Church and the Christian faith.

Water at open water and inland sites is often much colder than it looks, cold water can affect your ability to swim and self-rescue.


It's stronger than it looks
