WHAT WE HAVE DONE THIS WEEK

Starlings have had such a lovely week this week. We started the week introducing our new story, an old favourite, The three little pigs. the children enjoyed getting into role as the pigs and the wolf. They used the construction area to build their own houses but these were not safe with the big bad wolf on the prowl, she tried to blow them down.

Starlings enjoyed a walk to see the bluebells with Swallows class, a trip to the ice-cream parlour and some yoga. We have spent a lot of time in the garden making pies in the mud kitchen, playing hide and seek and building a pirate ship.

This week in Swallows, the children started off the week by releasing our four butterflies that we had watched grow from caterpillars into beautiful butterflies! This caused much excitement and the children really enjoyed setting them free.

In English we have started to learn our new story 'Mr Big' which the children are really enjoying. The children have learnt to orally retell the story using actions and they are now all ready to begin writing it next week, we are very much looking forward to seeing what they produce!

We have also started our new Science topic which is Living Things and their habitats. The children are always very keen to learn in Science which is great to see and we will keep you posted on the various things they have been up to over the next few weeks. As part of Mental Health Awareness week, along with the rest of the school, we took a walk in nature up to the bluebell woods.

This week we published our Non-chronological reports on the Rainforest. This means Robins have produced a fantastic booklet to share with the rest of the school. (See Facebook for photos.) We used our research skills in history to learn more about Maya gods. We find lots of information about their names, abilities and appearance and

produced fact files on our favourites. In Science we started our new topic States of matter and used a Kahoot! Quiz to see what we already knew. Robins love a good quiz! With all this learning we still made time to think about our mental health and how connecting with nature can help us. We all enjoyed a walk through Ripley to the waterfall and woods.

We are such experts at inference now in Robins! Using props we have been suggesting a huge variety of exciting predictions as to what our new English text could be about... we can't wait to find out if we were right! We continue to investigate the 2,4 and 8 times tables in maths and using the halving and doubling patterns we have discovered to solve problems. This week in computing we created a branching database using yes and no questions.. not as easy as it sounds! Our PSHE topic of 'Healthy Me' found us exploring the sugar content of some of our favourite foods and discussing what a healthy diet might look like.

UK PARLIAMENT WORKSHOP KS2

Next week, our KS2 children will be taking part in a live parliamentary workshop on the 20th May via Zoom. There will be two events taking place, an Introduction to Parliament and Laws and Debating. The children will learn about the work and role of the House of Commons and the House of Lords. They will learn about the difference between UK Parliament and Government, the work of MPs and members of the House of Lords, how laws are made and how they can get their voices heard. The children will also be introduced to how laws are made and who makes them. They will explore laws that can affect us all, follow the progress of a Bill through the House of Commons and the House of Lords, and take part in a virtual debate. We think that this will be a very interesting experience!

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Notice from the Department for Education - Summer term attendance expectations for schools School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply. This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance. As restrictions begin to lift, we know some families may be looking to take holidays during term time. Lateness - It is compulsory that your child arrives at school on time. If they are late into school (after the register is taken) this has to be recorded and will affect your child's attendance record.

Covid 19 - Whilst some restrictions are lifting may we please remind you to be vigilant with your children. If they are feeling unwell and present with any Covid symptoms, please do not send them to school and obtain a test. All Parents who enter the school premises are required to wear a mask at all times.


