WHAT WE HAVE DONE THIS WEEK

Well it's safe to say that Mary Berry has nothing on our little Starling star bakers! This week we have made krispie cakes and chocolate mud pies, and it's fair to say that they have really enjoyed snack time in their new roles as taste testers!

Starlings have had lots of fun in story time, where they have been making up their own stories with props, or telling stories from a book using the pictures as prompts. With the small crates we have in class, the children have loved using their imagination to make them into cars, Manitou forklifts, houses, present boxes and tractors. They even enjoyed an occasional nap in them! Starlings have ended another busy week by making their very own orange scented playdoh, which has provided countless hours of imaginative, creative fun today.

This week Swallows blasted off into space and landed on the moon! The children were very excited to come in on Monday and see a pair of silver space boots in the classroom! This was to mark the start of our moon landing topic in History. Over the next three weeks we will be learning about Neil Armstrong and the events of the Apollo 11 Moon Landing. The children have shown great enthusiasm towards the topic and have already learnt and remembered lots of key facts about Apollo 11's mission. There has also been great excitement in our caterpillar

corner as the caterpillars are now at the chrysalis stage. The children are eagerly waiting for the butterflies to make an appearance! Finally in PSHE the children have started a new topic all about being healthy and have produced some lovely work for this including a rhyme accompanied by actions to help us remember how to stay healthy.

Robins have been polishing their grammar skills this week, learning about writing in the first, second and third person, and also in the present perfect tense! We have been exploring and comparing the 2 and 4 times tables, enjoying finding patterns and similarities and differences between the two, and using these facts to solve word problems. During our investigation of the importance of religious festivals, we learnt about the Hindu goddess Lakshmi and considered what good fortune we would wish for ourselves and our families, our school and community, and for our world.

This week in French, Robins class have been learning the names of musical instruments and discussing which instruments they like and dislike. In History, we learnt about the Mayan number system and hieroglyphs. We had great discussions trying to decipher each glyph. We were then able to use the hieroglyph for cacao bean in our art designs on Tuesday. Have a look on Facebook for photos of our wonderful clay chocolate pots.

We have been reading about Greta Thunberg which resulted in a lovely discussion about mental health, and some great links to our worship theme this week of The Good Shepherd. What a caring, thoughtful class Robins are!


Overdue Dinner and Comet Club accounts
